<b>Housebound</b>	Flu Shingles PPV	<p>All housebound patients who are eligible for the relevant vaccination (adults &amp; children).</p> <p>For the shingles vaccination, in addition to the defined eligible cohorts, patients who are shielding and have turned or will reach the age of 80 during the lockdown period.</p> <p>All family contacts of extremely clinically vulnerable (flu only).</p>	DN Provider GP Confederation PCN	GPs are already contracted and are responsible for all their patients including housebound. If the GP practice does not have capacity, the SLA provides a mechanism by which DNs, Confeds or PCNs can vaccinate their patients
<b>Unregistered</b>	Flu Shingles PPV	<p>Adults Children</p> <p>For the shingles vaccination, in addition to the defined eligible cohorts, patients who are shielding and have turned or will reach the age of 80 during the lockdown period.</p> <p>This SLA should not be used to vaccinate GP staff as there is a separate mechanism for this.</p>	Individual GP practice	This SLA allows GPs to provide a flu vaccination to any patient who is not registered with a GP practices. The practice should encourage the patient to register with them.
<b>GP Confed/PCN</b>	Flu	Adults Children	GP Confederation PCN	If the GP does not have capacity to vaccinate all eligible patients or requires extra support, this SLA provides a mechanism by which Confeds/PCNs can vaccinate the GPs patients.
