Changes to flu vaccination QOF points



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Key points

- The QOF points allocated to flu vaccination are doubled in 2020/21 to 36 points for targets for four long term conditions (COPD, diabetes, stroke or TIA and coronary heart disease) and these are detailed in the table below.
- The QOF payment formula has also been amended so that instead of earning points on a linear scale (starting from 0 points to maximum points) between the lower and upper payment threshold, practices will accrue a greater number of points once they achieve the lower payment threshold (see table). This will mean practices will earn more for achieving the lower threshold with the remaining points being achieved in a linear manner between the upper and lower threshold.
- The total number of points in this year's QOF remains at 567 and the value of each QOF point has been increased to £194.83

Quality Improvement Domain - Learning disabilities

- One requirement of indicator QILD007 (27 points) is for practices to develop and implement a plan to improve their delivery of flu vaccinations to people with a Learning Disability for 2020/21. They should review their Learning Disabilities register and note any reasonable adjustments required.
- As part of the Quality Improvement Reporting Template for Learning Disabilities (Section 6.2 on page 33 of the attached guidance), practices will be required to answer these questions: How many flu vaccinations were provided at practice level to people with a learning disability in 2019/20 and how many flu vaccinations have been provided for 2020/21.
