Care Quality Commission (CQC) triggers guidance



 This is a desktop resource to inform practice team members of the situations that can trigger an announced or unannounced CQC visit.



Previous ratings



Normally your practice will be revisited by the CQC within a certain time period depending on your previous rating:

- Inadequate six months.
- Required Improvement 12 months.
- Good and Outstanding five years.

However, a trigger, can cause a visit from the CQC at anytime which can either be an <u>announced</u> inspection or an unannounced inspection.



What can trigger a CQC investigation?



- Complaints.
- Surveys.
- Friends and Family Test (FFT) responses.
- NHS comments on the practice website.
- Patient participation group (PPG).
- Care homes.
- Commissioners (NHS England/CCG).
- CQC annual regulatory review with <u>22 questions</u>.
